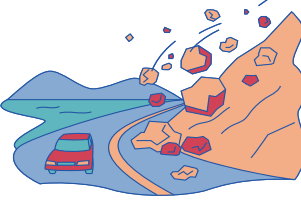

What to do during an Earthquake

Earthquake
Occurs

- Protect your head and body under a desk or table.



After the
shaking stops

- Check if your current location is safe.
- Check if a tsunami is coming or if buildings are collapsing.
- A fire is nearby
- You are near the sea
- You are near a cliff

Evacuation Shelter



- The first place to flee when a disaster occurs.
- Wide areas such as parks or schools.
- A place to escape from a tsunami.
- High-rise buildings, etc.
- People who cannot live in their homes due to a disaster gather here.
- You can receive food, water and blankets here.

- You can view various information regarding disasters and weather.

What is an Evacuation Shelter?

- A place to live when you cannot stay at home due to a disaster.
- Anyone can use it. It is free of charge.
- You can receive food, water, blankets, etc.



Life at the Shelter

- Go to the reception desk upon arrival.
- Please follow the rules and manners in the evacuation center.
- Check the bulletin board for new information.
- If you have questions, ask the staff at the reception.



Preparing for Evacuation

- When a disaster occurs, electricity, gas, and water services may stop.
- Food and water quickly sell out at supermarkets.
- Keep essential items in a bag so you can evacuate quickly.

- ☐ Toothbrush
- ☐ First-aid kit (Medicine)
- ☐ Masks

- ☐ Cash
- ☐ Pen and Notebook
- ☐ ID (Residence Card)

- ☐ Portable toilet
- ☐ Underwear
- ☐ Towels

- ☐ Flashlight
- ☐ Batteries (Power bank)

Useful Japanese for Disasters

ひなん 避難	Evacuation	Fleeing to a safe place.
よしん 余震	Aftershock	Smaller earthquakes that happen after a big one.
しんすい 浸水	Flooding	The roads will be flooded. Water enters the house.
はんらん 氾濫	Overflow	Water overflows from a river.
はつれい 発令	Announcement	An official notice has been issued.
ていでん 停電	Power Outage	Electricity is unavailable.
だんすい 断水	Water Outage	Water is unavailable.
ふっきゅう 復旧	Restoration	Utilities like electricity are working again.
きゅうすいじょ 給水所	Water Station	A place where you can get drinking water.
た　だ 炊き出し	Soup Kitchen	Food provided at evacuation shelters, etc.
